Objective 1



Enhance participant knowledge and understanding of SDOH frameworks and concepts



Objective 2



Strengthen participant's capacity and skills to integrate SDOH concepts in the design, analysis, dissemination, and implementation of research.



Objective 3



Expand the volume and quality of nurse-led research focused on health equity and SDOH through dissemination of research findings.

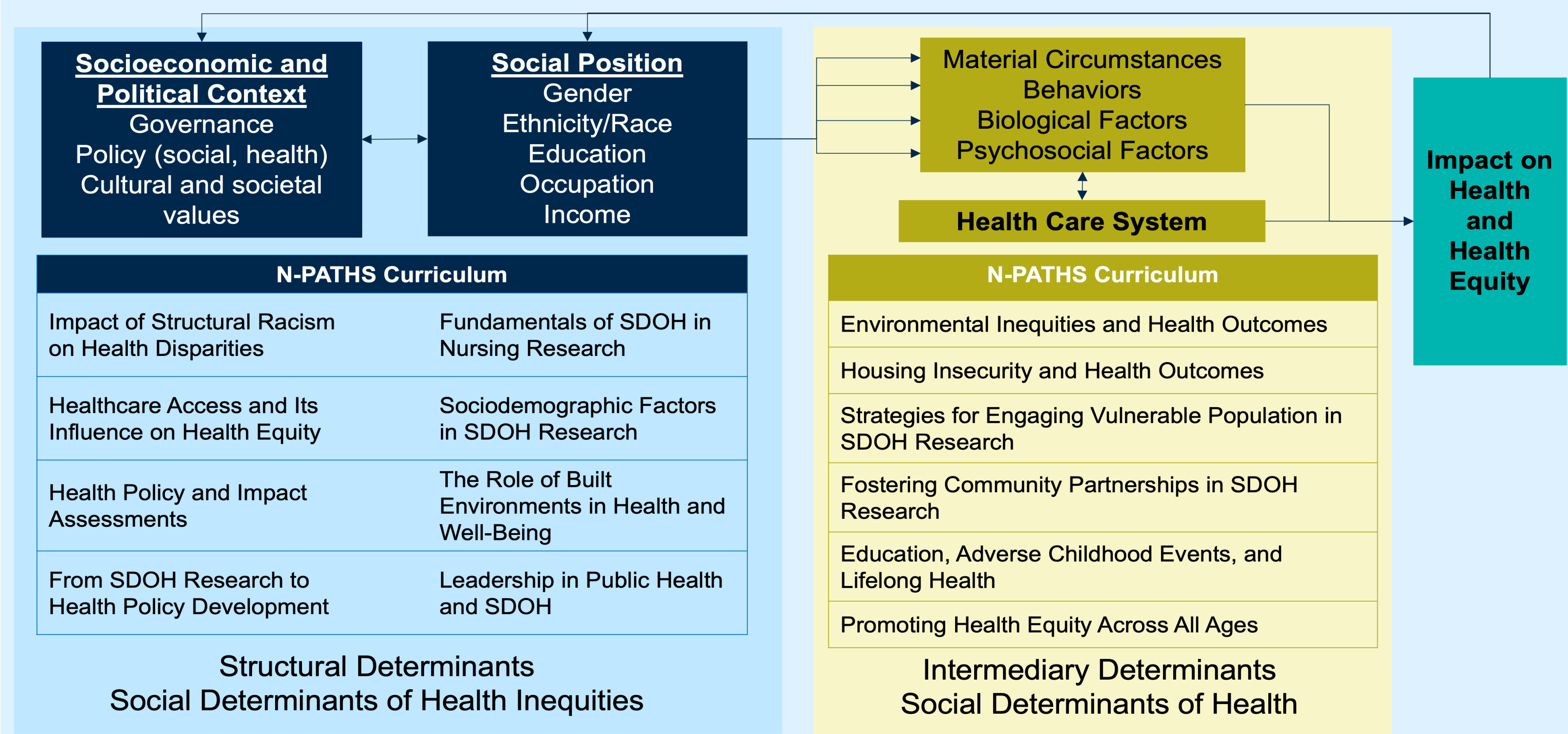


Figure 1. Conceptual Model of SDOH for the N-PATHS Program

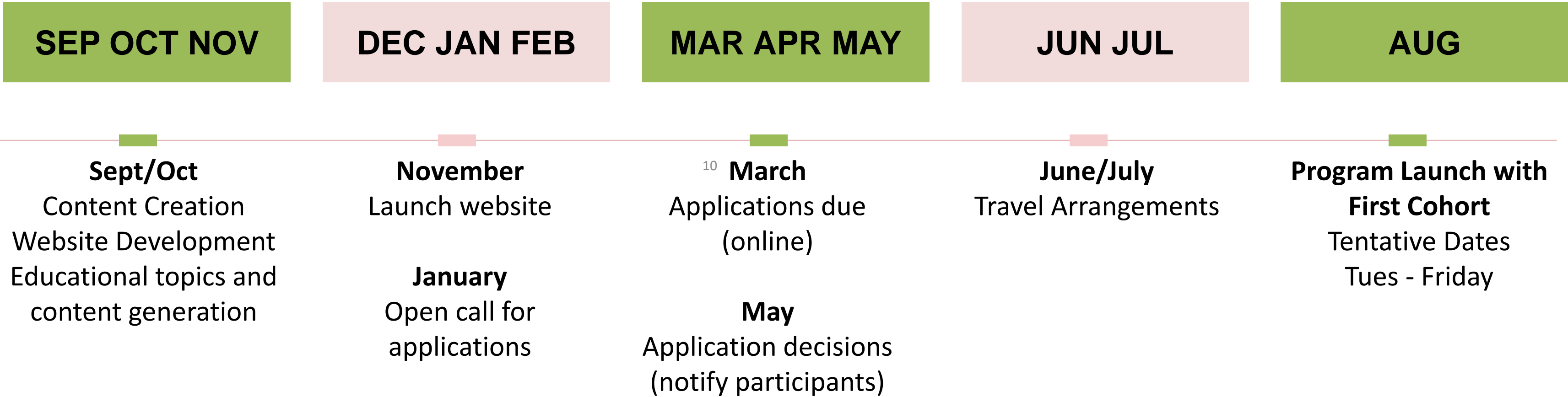
NPATHS Participants

- N-PATHS is anticipating selection of 10 – 12 'nurse scientists' (i.e., those with a nursing background).
 - Nursing graduates enrolled masters-level or doctoral programs,
 - Post-doctoral fellows,
 - Early career faculty (i.e., less than 5 years from completion of terminal degree)
 - Advanced practice/graduate nurses (e.g., CNS, NPs)
 - Allied healthcare professionals (e.g., residents, fellows, public health professionals)
- Designed to create a pathway for the advancement of underrepresented identities in nursing research
- Participants will be reimbursed for their travel (e.g., flight and hotel). All course materials will be provided by the program.
