SCIENTIFIC AWARDS

Dr. O. H. Gaebler, Head of the Biochemistry Department, Edsel B. Ford Institute for Medical Research, received the Ernest Bischoff Award in Clinical Chemistry at the meeting of the American Association of Clinical Chemists in Cleveland, August 27-29. His acceptance address was entitled, "Adventures in Clinical Chemistry." This Award is given annually to a chemist on the staff of a hospital or clinical laboratory who has distinguished himself by achievement and devotion and has helped solve those chemical problems which arise daily in the practice of the medical arts.

At the Annual Meeting of the American Gastroenterological Association in Atlantic City on June 6, 1959 Dr. Robert J. Priest was awarded the B. B. Vincent Lyon Prize for the best piece of research presented by any Associate Member of this Association. The research was entitled, "A New Qualitative Defect of Leukocyte Function in Ulcerative Colitis." Co-authors with Dr. Priest were Dr. John W. Rebeck, Department of Laboratories and Gerald T. Havey, Department of Medicine.
