PHILIP J. HOWARD, M.D.

A member of the Pediatric Department since 1927, Philip J. Howard has been the chairman of the Publications Committee of the Henry Ford Hospital Medical Bulletin since the first publication of the bulletin in March, 1953. Since that time he has personally directed the publication through fourteen and a quarter years during which time fifty-seven regular issues, totaling more than 6,000

pages, have appeared. The March, 1967 issue was the last one prepared under his direction. The new editorial group wishes to acknowledge Dr. Howard's devotion and perseverance to this Bulletin and will welcome his guidance in the future.

Dr. Howard joined the staff of Henry Ford Hospital in 1927 after a residency at Children's Hospital, Boston, Mass. He received his B.S. degree in 1921 from Wesleyan University, Middletown, Conn., and his M.D. from the Harvard Medical School, where he was a member of the Aesculapian Club. His internship was at Montreal General Hospital, Montreal, Canada, 1925-6. He was certified by the American Board of Pediatrics in 1934 and elected an examiner for the Board in 1953.

Dr. Howard is author and co-author of approximately 32 studies, including six papers on respiration of the newborn, four on the infant born after prolonged rupture of the amniotic membrane, three on tuberculosis, and two on hypoxia and the electroencephalogram in newborn in fants.

He is a member of the Michigan State Medical Society and the Wayne County Medical Society, serving on the latter's committee on maternal and child welfare; past president, Detroit Pediatric Society; past state chairman of the Michigan Chapter of the American Academy of Pediatrics and past chairman of its Committee on Welfare of the Fetus and Newborn; consultant to the committee on maternal and child welfare of the Michigan State Medical Society, and a member of the American Academy of Pediatrics and the Society for Pediatric Research.
